

Governance Board Nominations 2023

CBIP is seeking nominations for the election of **four** Board members from 31st July 2023. Nominations must be received by **30**th **April 2023**.

Nominees will need to have an understanding of:

- 1. CBIP's organisation, how it works and its importance for industry stakeholders
- 2. the importance of certification, accreditation and auditing processes relating to conformance with international standards is essential for these governance roles.

Selection will be based on the following criteria:

- 1. **Leadership skills**. Experience in leadership roles and evidence of how leadership skills have been applied in practice.
- Strategy and planning. Skills to work with a team to think and plan strategically to meet CBIP's organisation purpose and business objectives. This requires being able to clearly distinguish between governance roles and management roles. Critical skills, knowledge and attributes for this criterion including risk assessment and management, business planning and financial literacy.
- 3. **Decision making**. Critical thinking skills to analyse and evaluate information and data to inform CBIP's business decisions.
- 4. **Interpersonal skills**. Personal attributes and communication styles that are conducive to productive meetings and objective decisions. This includes professional conduct, willingness to express personal views, ability to set aside personal interests so that decisions are made in CBIP's best interests.
- 5. **Professional integrity**. A sound reputation for displaying values such as honesty, fairness, responsibility, professionalism, and ethical standards.
- 6. **Impartiality**. Ability to fulfil the responsibility of a Board member objectively and without conflicts of interests that would impair CBIP's business.

Nomination information is strictly confidential.

Nominations will be reviewed by the Nominations Committee for alignment with the nomination criteria.
